ALR bingo is the 29th, so we would like your help there as well.





Notes from the Department Service Officer

Temporary Increase in Compensation!

It is important that you let the DSO know when you are hospitalized for treatment or surgery of service connected conditions if you will be out of commission for over 21 days. You may be eligible for a temporary increase to 100% for the time of your treatment and recovery. This applies to treatment at either a VA or Civilian hospital. Don't expect the VA hospital to notify the Veteran's Benefit Administration. Call or email the DSO so we can discuss your case.



Filing Claims!

Always check with your Service Officer before filing any claims for increase or new claims as you could jeopardize your current rating. It is a good idea to make either an in-person or telephonic appointment to go over your proposed claim. This also applies to any Notice of Disagreements. We can save you a lot of time and effort.

Elimination of Informal Claims!

The VA will be eliminating "informal" claims. Starting on March 24, 2015 all claims must be filed on the approved VA form. Make an appointment when you are thinking of filing a new claim or an increase to a current disability. The VA will no longer accept Notice of Disagreement by letter, it must be on the appropriate VA Form. We can help you through the process.
