US Naval Sea Cadet Corps - NCB 39 Battalion



Greetings,

February was a busy month for the unit. 19-21 February found us joining the South Portland unit for a weekend of fun and adventure at the Maine Maritime Academy. The cadets spent time aboard the TS State of Maine learning how the ship operates while at sea. They toured the Marine Biology lab and got to handle various small sea creatures living in the lab's experiment pools. A tour of the Marine Propulsion lab exposed the cadets to the ins and outs of different marine engines. The finality was the hands-on training in the Ship Simulator where they worked as the bridge crew handling a 900 foot tanker in San Francisco Bay.

Our weekend drill of 04-06 March was based upon preparations for our annual Open Ranks Inspection. On Sunday, the Open Ranks personnel inspection was conducted at 1000 in the main hall of the Legion by LCDR Holley Forbes, NSCC, Regional Director New England Region 015. Among the honored guests were Senator Rod Whittemore,

Representative Brad Farrin and Post 39 Commander H. Ralph Withee. This was followed by the inspection of the record keeping and financial audit. The unit passed with an excellent overall score of 3.72 out of a possible 4.0.

The weekend of 18-20 March again found the unit at the Maine Maritime Academy. This time it was in competition with 120 cadets from New England JROTC units during the Leadership Challenge Weekend sponsored by the Navy ROTC

unit at MMA. It included physical training challenges, swimming pool challenges, military drill challenges and tug-of-war challenges. The cadets competed admirably and had a good time.

Preparations are now underway for the Small Arms/Squad Tactics National Advanced Training to be based out of the Legion Hall from 17-23 April.

We have cadets coming from Puerto Rico, Florida, Iowa, Louisiana and Massachusetts as well as from the South Portland unit and our unit.

I, on behalf of the entire battalion, wish to thank the local communities, the entire Legion membership, cadet's families and friends for their untiring support of this unit. Notes from the Service Officer

Excerpts from the Department Service Officer News Letter:

Agent Orange Update

The VA is once again adding ships to the Agent Orange Ship list. The update was made on November 2015.

Exposure to Agent Orange by Location

Part of the United States' strategy in Vietnam was to conduct an herbicide program to remove foliage providing cover for the enemy. Agent Orange was the most widely used of the herbicide combinations sprayed.

Agent Orange and other herbicides used in Vietnam were tested or stored elsewhere, including some military bases in the United States.

•Exposure to Agent Orange in Vietnam

Exposure on land in Vietnam or on a ship operating on the inland waterways of Vietnam between January 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975

·C-123 Airplanes and Agent Orange Residue

Possible exposure of crew members to herbicide residue in C-123 planes flown after the Vietnam War

·Blue Water Veterans

Possible exposure on open sea ships off the shore of Vietnam during the Vietnam War

•U.S. Navy and Coast Guard Ships in Vietnam

Ships and boats with operations in Vietnam between January 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975 – On the list.

·Korean Demilitarized Zone

Exposure along the demilitarized zone in Korea between April 1, 1968 and August 31, 1971

Thailand Military Bases

Possible exposure on or near the perimeters of military bases between February 28, 1961 and May 7, 1975

·Herbicide Tests and Storage Outside Vietnam

Possible exposure due to herbicide tests and storage at military bases in the United States and locations in other countries

Vietnam Veterans and their survivors should check the list on a periodic basis and let the DSO know if your ship turns up on the list!

Non-VA Emergency Healthcare!

This is an ongoing issue for our veterans and results in BIG bills that the VA will not pay.

YOU MUST CONTACT THE VA WITHIN 72 HOURS IF YOU HAVE EMERGENCY CARE!

I have attached the Nov-VA Emergency Healthcare flyer from the VA. Please post in your Legion Hall! VHA eligible veterans <u>must</u> follow these procedures or they may be billed by non-VA providers and will be responsible for payment.

Always shop around when obtaining health-care. NOTE: It might be cheaper to use Medicare/Mainecare/Tricare for Life or your personal health insurance! Be a wise consumer of healthcare; shop around for non-emergency care!
