LEGION UPDATES.....From your Commander

Comrades,

When I became Commander 13 years ago, the roof leaked and the windows were in need of repair.

With everyone's help, Post 39 has..

1. Roof+Windows+Doors—\$50,000 This was accomplished with the help of the members and community donations.
2. New Dance Floor - \$8,000
3. A larger bar was installed and all the work volunteered by the Post members and the cost of materials was \$2,000.
4. The Post went non-smoking and a smoking room was built with the help from members. The only cost was for the materials.
5. New ceiling and lights were installed in the dance area and the bar with a cost of about \$3,000.

6. A new chair lift was installed with a cost of \$4,000 which was raised by the 120 Club proceeds. In addition, the Post started the dances up again with the help of John Bryant, Mark Long, John Ziacoma and myself.

7. Approximately 6 years ago we started the 120 Club which brought in about \$25,000-\$30,000.

8. I started selling ads for the newsletter to local businesses which made the newsletter no cost to the Post. Now it brings in \$3,000 per year.

All of the aforementioned repairs are paid in full. We also installed 3 heat pumps - 2 downstairs and 1 upstairs with a total cost of \$14,000. The balance owed is about \$6,000.

One of the things that I found most satisfying as Commander was helping the families with the military funerals.

I have enjoyed my years as your Commander and all of our accomplishments. We have a strong Post, let's keep it going.

I wish to thank my family for all the help and support they have given me.

I'd like to wish the new officers the best of luck.

Notes from the Department Service Officer

Excerpts Taken From "The Maine Legionnaire"

The Court of Appeals for Veterans Appeals decided to service connect a blue water navy veteran with a presumptive condition of agent orange. The VA is in the process of trying to figure out how this is going to work. They will try to appeal the decision. Meanwhile they are setting the parameters for service connection. All claims that are still active in the system for blue water navy had been put on hold until the final decision is made.

The Appeals Modernization Act went live on the 19th of this month. I will not explain everything about the new program but here are some of the highlights. There is no more RAMP program. There will be no more opt in letters. They did keep the two lanes that made up the RAMP. There are now 3 lanes that the veteran can choose from. The choices are:

Supplemental Claim Lane
Higher Level Review lane
Appeal to the Board Lane

****A note from your Post Service Officer****

I think it's about time VA finally considered this. If you are a blue water Navy Veteran and you have not been granted service connection for presumptive conditions, get your stuff ready. If you can prove you were in Vietnam, that is best. If you can prove your ship docked and you went ashore, that is just as good (you have to tell VA that you went ashore). I encourage you to apply. It will be put on hold for a while, but I believe the more claims in the system will be more likely that VA cannot go back on the ruling (which they are trying to do). This also will assure that if service connection is granted, then you will get the earliest effective date possible. Be patient. and keep trying.

If you have generic questions about your claim, please feel free to ask me. If you have specific questions, it probably would be best to call the department service officer (if I can't answer I will refer you to Carl anyway).

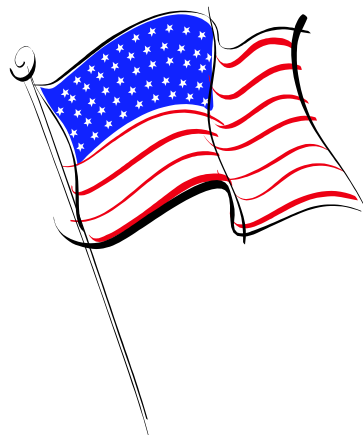
