### Notes from the Post Service Officer

We are often asked at the Post how to find service discharge records needed to join the Legion Family or to apply for benefits.

The Post does have many DD214 copies in our files and that would be the first place to look.

If the veteran was a resident of Maine when entering the military, The Maine Bureau of Veterans Services will have a copy of the DD214.

If the veteran is deceased, you must be a next of kin to apply for the copy. The Phone number for the Augusta office is 207-626-4464. The web site is http://www.maine.gov/dvem/b vs/. You can also visit their office at Togus, Building 248 Room 110, phone number 207-287-9933.

If the veteran was not originally from Maine, you can apply for records at:

http://www.archives.gov/vetera ns/military-service-records/. It is important to supply as much identifying information as you can when applying.

If you need help in applying for VA benefits, The Department of Maine, American Legion has two Service Officers at Togus to help you with the process. They are located on the third floor of Building 205. You can make an appointment by calling 207-623-5726 and asking to speak to Maureen or Carl. They give excellent service and are very knowledgeable of the claims process and will represent you in every step of the claims process.

If you need transportation call me at 635-2051 and I will help you arrange it.
