We had some coming through the back door as well. Next year I plan on having a system in place to get a more accurate count. After expenses we made a profit of \$805.18 which will go towards local High School scholarships.

Our Annual Turkey Supper & Raffle hosted by the Legion and Auxiliary was a huge success as well! A lot of work goes in to preparing for this event. A HUGE THANK YOU to the Legion, SAL, Legion Riders and Auxiliary members for their donations. In addition, Thank you to all those who helped out!! After expenses we made a profit of \$1,200.66 which benefits our area food cupboards!

At our November meeting we voted on the following donations: \$100 to the Skowhegan Giving Tree, \$25 to the Department President's Lobster Dip, \$300 Maine Veterans Home, \$50 to the Senior Citizen's Thanksgiving Dinner, \$50 to the Somerset Residential Activities Fund, \$25 to the Creative Arts Festival and \$20 for the Veterans Christmas Bag.

Since the last newsletter, Maxine Dube has mailed

out over \$20,000 worth of coupons. A great big <u>THANK</u> <u>YOU</u> to Maxine and all who donate coupons. A special <u>THANK YOU</u> to all those who help to cut them for shipping.

Remember our Adult Christmas Party is on December 9th. Social Hour is from 5-6 pm and dinner is at 6 pm. This is where we get together to wrap the children's gifts and decorate the

tree. A wonderful night of camaraderie and fun!

## US Naval Sea Cadet Corps - NCB 39 Battalion



Greetings,

Drill weekend of 10-12 Nov, started as planned with the preparation for and participation in the Veterans Day ceremonies at the Forest Hill Cemetery and the American Legion Post 39. After lunch, high winds forced the cancellation of the planned Legion Formal Flag Retirement ceremony and the-implementation of Plan B studying manuals and taking the written exams required for rank advancement. The evening was filled with discussion concerning the events planned for the trip to and training to be accomplished at the US Coast

Guard Station, Jonesport, Maine.

Saturday started with a 3-hour drive to Jonesport. Upon arrival, we were greeted by our unit's Training Officer, LtJG Horvat, NSCC who is also an active duty US Coast Guard Petty Officer. There was a full day of training planned for the cadets that included aboard 47 and 87-foot Coast Guard boats, touring the different operations activities, classroom training on nautical navigation, hands-on emergency water pump operation and discussions with on-duty US Coast Guard personnel. The highlight of the day was going out into the harbor aboard the 47-foot boat. Each cadet got to maneuver the boat from the helm. The final event for the cadets was participation in the Coast Guard Station's evening colors activities and the folding of the colors. # How to Apply for VA Health Care

You can apply for VA Healthcare in three ways:

- Online: Health care application on <u>www.vets.gov</u>.
- Paper: VA Form 10-10EZ, then submit to the VHA or submit to your VSO for transmittal. (I can help you fill it out
- Telephone: 877-222-VETS (8387) (8:00 am 8:pm EST).

When you apply make sure you have your (DD 214) Separation Document and last year's Income Tax filing nearby as you will need information from those documents during the application process.

P.S. Reapply if you were "Group 8 in the past and your income has changed; have retired and are just living on Social Security (Call me for income limits)

NOTE: Assets are NO LONGER counted toward VHA eligibility.
