## US Naval Sea Cadet Corps - NCB 39 Battalion (%)



Greetings,

Friday evening, 04 Dec, was typical with berthing being setup and study time. Saturday morning started with an 0600 reveille followed by morning colors and chow. Classroom instruction in the areas of Customs & Courtesies, the Eleven General Orders of a Sentry and knot-tying followed. The morning's final activity was Dress Blue uniform check and inspection.

After lunch, classroom instruction covered Rates & Ranks, Drill & Ceremony and Watch-Standing. The cadets

changed into their Dress Blues and then joined the guests at the Legion Auxiliary's soup Dinner in the main Legion Hall. Once dinner was finished, there was a last minute uniform inspection in preparation for the 3rd Annual Madison Christmas Lights parade. The unit watched the fireworks display and then moved to the parade starting point on Maple Street. The cadets provided a unique Color Guard for this parade. For the first time ever, they formed a line with six flag bearers and two riflemen. After the parade was finished, the cadets returned to the Legion Hall and had a pizza party.

Sunday started with an 0600 reveille, morning colors, chow and then classroom time covering the Chain of Command. Personal Conduct and School Grades requirements. After lunch, there was some class time covering Advanced Trainings for the next calendar year. The cadets then took down berthing and cleaned the facilities. Final formation was held with E-1 Zackary Small being promoted to E-2, all cadets receiving Completion Certificates from the US Navy for their Survival Train-

ing at the US Navy's SERE School this past September and E-3 Jonathen Jackson and E-2 Trevor Edes each receiving the Community Service Ribbon. Cadets were dismissed at 1530.

I, on behalf of the entire battalion, wish to thank the local communities, the entire Legion membership, cadet's families and friends for their untiring support of this unit.
