I hope you all have a Merry Christmas and a happy New Year.



# Notes from the Service Officer

#### New ADSO – Maureen Malley!



Meet our new Assistant Department Service Officer, Maureen Malley, USAF, Retired. Maureen retired from the United States Air Force at Hill AFB, Utah, prior to that she served as a Law Enforcement Specialist, stationed at Lackland AFB, Texas.

She has an Associate's Degree in Science of the Family and Human Studies, and Certificates in Business Administration, and Accounting Clerk. She arrived in Maine in November of 2015. She is a member of American Legion Post 6 in Hallo-well, Maine.

She looks forward to getting trained up and starting to assist our membership and veterans in Maine and across the US.

#### Veterans who are Incarcerated!

It is always important to notify the VA of any changes to your status, i.e. dependency changes. This includes incarceration. There are rules regarding receipt of payment of compensation and pension while a veteran is incarcerated. Your best course of action is to notify the VA directly (1-800-827-1000) and through your Department Service Officer. If you are married or have children, you may be able to apportion (divide) your benefits among your spouse and/or children (Under 18 or Under 23) attending college. Failure to pay attention to this and notify the VA can result in a large debt to the government!

#### **Dealing with Other Federal Agencies!**

The Department Service Officers are accredited by the American Legion and the VA to represent you with the Veterans Benefits Administration Only!

We can and do try to assist you with other agencies (Social Security, Defense Finance and Accounting Center etc.) however, you MUST BE PRESENT in the Department Service Office. We have no standing with those organizations.

I know it can be frustrating to the veteran or spouse, but it is for your privacy and it is the law. We can help you explain your situation and try to seek resolution.

This situation also applies to the Veterans Health Administration; we can assist you in explaining your concern and help you seek assistance regarding your VA Healthcare.
