#### Camp Lejeune Claims!

The VA is accepting claims for compensation from those veterans who served at Camp Lejeune for a period of 30 days during certain years. This information has already been provided under separate cover.

If you have submitted for the Camp Le- 5726, to make arrangements; please have jeune conditions and were denied, you the date, time and location available must resubmit your claim! when calling or emailing.

#### **Contract Comp and Pen Exams!**

Let your folks know that comp and pen exams (rating exams) are now being done by contractors. The companies being used are QTC and VES. If they get calls from these organizations trying to schedule an exam. They should be legitimate.
