Notes from the Department Service Officer

***Excerpts Taken From DSO Newsletter ***

The year is winding down, elections are happening across the state and new leadership teams are being installed. This event hopefully comes with fresh new ideas on how to help the post, district, and department. I truly am excited to see were we as a legion go. One thing that will not change is the need for service officers in the legion family. I hope you noticed that I typed legion family. I believe that we are all in this together. The legion, auxiliary, sons, and riders. I should expect more of the legion family to come to my service officer's seminar. I know we all want to help when we see a veteran struggling. The seminar only helps you do that.

From the day I started here I wanted to conduct more outreach. To move in that direction, we have gone paperless in filing claims. We fill out the paperwork, sign the forms electronically, then directly upload it into the VBA system. Once we moved past that hurdle the next step was to be able to remotely access the VBA system from a laptop. I am proud to say that all the efforts proved very positive. I can now go to Madawaska, Maine access the VBA system and submit files there. This marks a whole new level of outreach. Who knows what the next step is going to be. I may just show up at a post for some coffee and file claims. This is all very exciting, I cannot wait to see were these takes us.

The Appeals Modernization Act went live on the 19th of February. This marks a considerable change to not only the way appeals are filed but also claims. There are more options for the veteran to choose from. I have listed the different options below with a brief explanation of each.

Supplemental Claim Lane- This lane is used if you have ever filed a claim for a condition and it was denied. No matter when it was filed, and you must have new and material evidence.

Higher Level Review lane- This lane is used when you find a clear and unmistakable error on the VA.

Appealing to the Board of veterans appeals has three lanes; they are:

Direct docket – appellant receives a direct review by BVA based on the evidence before VBA in the decision on appeal. No new evidence allowed. The record is closed.

Evidence Submission – appellant may submit evidence within the 90-day window following submission of the NOD. There is no duty to assist and the record is otherwise closed.

Hearing – appellant will be scheduled for a BVA hearing. Additionally, the appellant may submit evidence within the 90-day window following the scheduled hearing. BVA does not have a duty to assist and the record is otherwise closed.

Please advise all veterans to contact this office if they disagree with a claim decision. This office can help the veteran through this process.
