### Notes from the Post Service Officer

Are you a veteran who got hurt while you were in the Army? Did you develop a disease while serving aboard ship in the Navy? Were you injured when the pilot of your plane banked hard and you were hit with a flying object that was supposed to be tied down while you were in the Air Force? Did you get an infection while serving in the Marines? Do you still have these disabilities? Are you getting paid for them?

I am talking about compensation and pension with the VA. The 3 things VA needs to grant service connection are 1) an event in service. 2) a current diagnosis. And 3) a nexus, or link between 1 and 2. You know if you got hurt. You know if it still bothers you. If you think that your current symptoms are related to your injury/disease in service, then you should file a claim for that. If you are awarded compensation, then the money you receive is tax free for the rest of your life. You can go to the regional office in Augusta. You can speak with a service officer (Carl Curtis 623-5726; you can call me after 2:30 pm as I am still working. 485-1072 (and if I don't know the answer I will refer you to Carl anyway.)) You can file on-line (www.va.gov). You can call 1 800-827-1000 but you may be on hold for a while.

If you are already service connected, and you think your condition has gotten worse, then file a claim. There is a possibility that you could get an increase, which could mean more money for you. Just remember that there is also a possibility that exam shows improvement, which could result in less money for you. If you have questions, then talk to a service officer.

Pension is payable to qualified individuals if your income is very low. Pension questions should go to Carl as I don't know all the requirements.


