## Notes from the Post Service Officer

As many of you are Vietnam era veterans, here is some information for you. VA has just added 3 more conditions to the presumptive list as related to agent orange exposure: Bladder Cancer, hypothyroidism, and Parkinsonism (and Parkinsons like symptoms). It is going to take a bit for VA how to figure out how these will be granted, but if you have one of these, and you were stationed in Vietnam, or the coastal waterways, then put in a claim. They will be processed by date received. If you already have diabetes, prostate cancer, or coronary artery disease, and you are service connected for any/all of these, then processing your claim should be a bit quicker, but the VA is not going to ask you. You need to be proactive to get the claim going first.

If you have any questions about this or anything else concerning your veteran's benefits, you can contact me or the department service officer (If I don't know the answer, then I will send you to the department service officer anyway: Carl Curtis 623-5726).
