Drill weekend for April was unique. Our normal routine of setting-up berthing and study time on Friday belied what lay ahead for Saturday.

Saturday started with an 0600 reveille call followed by an hour of PT, morning chow and then we loaded up the vehicles and headed to Skowhegan for Swim Qualification testing to the US Navy Standards. The cadets spent the better part of 2.5 hours in the pool doing some type of swim challenge. When all said and done, 2 cadets qualified as

At 1600, we headed back to Skowhegan for 3 hours of CPR, First-Aid and AED training at the Redington-Fairview hospital. All of the cadets were certified in these areas and will receive their Red Cross certification cards which are valid for two years. The cadets were tired at 'lights out".
