Notes from the Service Officer

Proposals to Reduce Compensation!

It is important to note that your compensation level and ratings are based on your current level of disability. Therefore, it is subject to change both up, down; or even eliminated when the disability no longer exists.

It is important, unless you are 100% Permanent and Total, not to incorporate your VA compensation into your monthly bill paying if at all possible. Failure to take his into account may cause financial hardship if your rating is reduced or eliminated; and it could be quite financially significant.

NOTE: Anytime you reopen a claim with the VA, you are subject to re-examination; even if you are 100% P&T.

The rated disability does not become permanent until the rating has been in effect for over 20 years!

If you have a question about your claim, please feel free to ask me, or call the Service Office in Augusta 623-5726 (If I can't get you the answer, I will have you call them anyway).
