Notes from the Service Officer

Taken from the newsletter of the Department Service Officer.

Free Flu Shots!

If you are enrolled in VA Healthcare, October is FREE flu shot month. See attached flyer. The shots are available at Togus, Community Based Outreach Centers and at All Walgreens locations (through March 31, 2016) with VA Health Identification card.

Intent to File!

More and more veterans are electing to submit an "Intent to File" (ITF) for VA benefits. (VA Form 21-0966) This form establishes "date of claim" in most cases on the date filed as long as you have a diagnosis for a service connected condition. The ITF allows a veteran to file a fully developed claim (FDC), with all supporting evidence, that may result in faster processing (120 days average) This includes pension and survivor benefits claims as well.

If they do not provide the claim evidence and file a formal claim within one year (VA Form 21-526EZ/VA 21-534EZ/VA Form 21-527EZ) of the date the ITF, they return to the month the claim was filed. Also, the VA has been mandated under law to help you obtain your civilian medical records, if they cannot, then the burden returns to the veteran. Make sure your post members know how this works. Make sure YOU know how this works so your veterans do not lose compensation or pension benefits. Some are coming in after the expiration of the "ITF" on record. The benefit of a Fully Developed Claim (FDC) is a faster processing time, normally under 120 days here at Togus Veteran Regional Office.
