* Members suggested buying new kitchen tools for the post, badly needed with all the fundraising dinners being held. Discussion is continuing.


* Planning took place for the Sept. 24 pig roast, which turned out to be a big success. Thank you Eddie Cowan and team!

Notes from the Service Officer

Debt Letters from the VA

Why did I get this debt letter from St Paul VA? We hear this question quite often when a veteran receives a collection letter for an overpayment of benefits.

There are some of the many reasons this happens:

- Failure to notify the VA of change in Dependents

- Failure to return validation documents regarding income or dependents.

- Removal of dependents; it takes a month or so to kick in and you owe them for the months they paid you.

- Veterans on a pension who start to draw Social Security (Income) and fail to report it.

- Failure to attend class or notify the VA when you drop out if you are receiving VA Educational Benefits.

- Selling your VA Loan Guaranteed house at a loss.

Etc...

The debt collections can be small or amazingly large. It is your responsibility to know what you are getting compensation/pension for; and if that changes you must notify the VA immediately, hopefully through the DSO, and put aside the difference in benefits as they WILL come to collect it.

Changes in mailing address without notifying the "VBA" can compound this problem and cause you to lose your appeal time. It is not sufficient to just notify the VA Hospital you must notify Benefits.

The normal process is for the VA to notify you of a pending collection. You are given a time-

frame to reply. If you don't reply or you are in fact over receiving, the debt will be forwarded to VA in St. Paul to collect the overpayment.

If you ignore the collection letter from St. Paul, they will collect the overpayment from your compensation/pension. If that is not available they will try to collect from your Social Security and Pension. Contact the DSO immediately when you are told of an overpayment and we will help you proceed.

Every day you delay is one day less to attempt to request a waiver or payment plan.

P.S. You will not normally be charged due to VA error in an award of compensation or benefits.

Sign Up for VA Healthcare

Online VA Health Care Application (In lieu of VA Form 10-10ez)

Beginning June 30, 2016, Veterans applying for VA health care will be directed to the health care application on <u>www.vets.gov</u>.

Veterans will still have access to VA Form 10-10EZ, which was originally available through the Veterans On-line Application.

Those applying for health care eligibility can use the online application or call 877-222-VETS (8387) and sign up telephonically!


