US Naval Sea Cadet Corps - NCB 39 Battalion 🎉



The battalion has been very busy and upbeat since our last report.

Memorial Day services were supported by the Battalion. We provided the Color Guard and a formation for the Anson to Madison parade with services in Anson, Madison, East Madison and Starks. The day concluded with services at the VFW Post in Madison where the cadets presented the White Wreath.

On 4/5 Jun 12 we held our normal drill activities as well as prepared the paperwork for one cadet to attend the Petty Officer Leadership Academy in MA, paperwork for two cadets to attend Basic Military Training at Ft. Devens, MA and finalized plans for the

Battalion to participate in the Boston-Pease Air Show in Portsmouth, NH, a 3-day event.

On Friday morning, 29 Jun, the cadets met some of the Blue Angel's pilots and crew members and were allowed to ask questions and pose for photographs. After lunch, the cadets had front row, center-stage seats for the practice Air Show. Afterwards they had a photo taken with the 7 Blue Angel's pilots. During the Air Show on Saturday & Sunday, the cadets provided security for the private corporate chalets as well as manned our souvenir concession stand.

From 08 July – 14 July, we had 2 cadets along with 38 other cadets from around the nation attend advanced training in South Portland, Maine. PO3 Babin and 14 other cadets attended Scuba Training and received their PADI Certification for open water/salt water to a depth of 60 feet. CPO Coulombe and 24 other cadets attended Advanced Coast Guard Training at the Northern New England Sector, US Coast Guard Station.


On 20 July, we went to Camp Keyes, Augusta, Maine were the cadets spent time with SFC Roscoe, USA learning proper weapons handling and firing skills which they later demonstrated on the weapons simulator. The cadets fired the M-16 at simulated ranges of 50 -300 meters. LC-3 Fennel qualified as Marksman and will receive his medal for

that score. Other cadets requalified for previously earned ribbons and appurtenances.

On 21 July, the Battalion provided a Color Guard and formation for the 3rd Annual Athens Family Fun day parade.

Finally, we held drill the weekend of 4/5 August. Final actions were completed and plans for transporting 3 cadets to Boot Camp at Camp Niantic, CT were finalized. We wish to thank everyone or their continued support of our Battalion.
