

### US Naval Sea Cadet Corps - NCB 39 Battalion (



Greetings,

The unit has been very active since the last newsletter. We held a 3.5 day drill over the Memorial Day weekend. We supported the American Legion and the Towns of Madison, East Madison and Starks memorial activities by providing the Color Guard and a unit formation.

PO1 Riley Coleman was selected as one of the six USNSCC Cadet Escorts for the NSCC International Exchange Program held in Newport, RI. Forty-nine cadets from Australia, Canada, Singapore, Sweden, Hong Kong

and the United Kingdom attended this 16-day event. While there, PO1 Coleman was multifunction. In addition to the normal Petty Officer requirements, she was the Morale, the Recreation and the Mess Deck Petty Officer in charge. They visited Boston and New York City as a part of the program. Additionally, as team leader of a group consisting of a cadet from each of the attending nations, she led the team to first place in the Boston Historical Site scavenger hunt.

During the morning of 21 Jun, eight tested for their Ama-

teur Radio License. Unfortunately there was not the success rate that we had hoped for. After lunch, five cadets heading for Boot Camp were tested on the Physical Training Requirements for attendance. All qualified for attendance.

From 12-18 Jul, we had four cadets and two officers spend 6 days in South Portland, Maine for National Level Advanced training. Two cadets and one officer attended Advanced Coast Guard training at the Coast Guard Station and two cadets and

one officer attended the Petty Officer Leadership Academy (POLA) held at the Legion Hall. Coast Guard attendees received their US Coast Guard certification in Hazardous Materials Handling at the Operational Level.

From 21 Jul – 02 Aug, we had five cadets attend Boot Camp at Ft Devens, MA. We had one cadet that was a mem-

ber of the Honor Squad and received an award for this.

On 17 Aug, we supported the fourth Annual Combat Wounded Warrior event held at the Williams Machine Gun Range in North Anson.

We held drill from 21-24 Aug. Friday, 22 Aug found the cadets completing the Community Service Project at the Revolutionary War Veterans cemetery in North Anson. They tore down and removed the old dilapidated fencing and completely replaced the posts and railing. On Sat 23 Aug, the unit provided the Color Guard and a unit formation for the 38th Annual Madison-Anson Days parade as well as for the special awards ceremony for WWII Veteran Nunzio Biondello, a retired USAF NCO, held at the American Legion Hall.

Sunday morning was relatively quiet with our normal routine of reveille, chow and class time on numerous topics deemed important by the cadets, including recruitment. After lunch we held class time discussing our plan for Sep Drill... US NAVY SERE school to be held at the SEAL Facility near Rangeley, followed by clean-up and our closing ceremony. CA

(E-2) Faucett was promoted to CN (E-3) and CR (E-1) Fennell & Edes were both promoted to CA (E-2).

I, on behalf of the entire battalion, wish to thank the local communities, the entire Legion membership, cadet's families and friends for their untiring support of this unit. 
