Notes from the Service Officer

Taken from the newsletter of the Department Service Officer.

Changes to Your VA Compensation and Pension

We are seeing are several veterans who are getting in debt to the government regarding overpayments by the VA. Here are the two most common ways this happens. The most common cause is the starting of your Social Security Benefits and changes to dependent status.

1. Veterans on Non Service Connected Pension When a veteran is in receipt of a NSC connected

pension almost any other income, to include Social Security, must be deducted from the pension. This

includes ALL family income to include the earnings of your spouse and children! Failure to notify the VA will result in an overpayment. This also occurs when a veteran has a change in dependency status, i.e. divorce or aging out of children. If you do not notify the VA and put the overpayment aside you will be incur a debt that in most cases, must be repaid.

Veterans who are receiving Service Connected Compensation. If you are receiving service connected compensation and your dependency changes, i.e. divorce, your benefits decrease. You must notify the VA of ANY changes to dependency to avoid debt. The process involves a VA notification letter to you about the overpayment. You have sixty days to respond if the letter is in error. Your debt will then go to

collection. Collection is done by the Veterans Regional Office in St. Paul, MN. They will send you a debt letter, with payment instructions. Do not ignore it!

You have appeal rights and you will lose those rights if you do not appeal in a timely manner; as indicated in the letter. They will collect from your compensation if any, pension if any, and then go on to collect from any other government payments; i.e. Social Security, Tax refunds etc. Contact the American Legion Service Office if you need help putting together your letter requesting waiver, compromise or payment plan. You must come into the office to do this, it also involves filling out a VA form 5655, (Financial Status Report) you should bring this form, filled out, with you when you come to your assistance appointment to avoid multiple office visits.

Sign Up for VA Healthcare Online VA Health Care Application

(In lieu of VA Form 10-10ez)

Beginning June 30, 2016, Veterans applying for VA health care will be directed to the health care application on www.vets.gov.

Veterans will still have access to VA Form 10-10EZ, which was originally available through the Veterans On-line Application.

Those applying for health care eligibility can use the online application or call 877-222-VETS (8387) and sign up telephonically
